This is a ONE-WAY Walk

Start Point: the car park at the play space on Fittis Road (NO 085 238) adjacent to Old Gallows Road (the road that leads to Noah's Ark). There is some limited parking but the easiest way to get there is by the number 7 (Park & Ride) bus.

Dementia Café is a monthly gathering where people with dementia, their family, caregivers and friends can be together in a safe, welcoming environment, in the company of other caregivers. This is a group for people who are able to attend safely on their own, or who are accompanied by someone to support them. Volunteers and health and social care professionals are available for the purpose of emotional support, advice/guidance and opportunities for social interaction.

Starter packs is a charity run solely by volunteers which provides packs containing basic household items such as pots, pans, crockery, cutlery, towels, toiletries, bedding etc to low income and previously homeless individuals and families who have been given a new tenancy in the Perth and Kinross area.

They also provide kettles, toasters and slow cookers when they are donated or when funding allows. Cash donations are used to supplement the packs when there is a shortfall and to pay for the running of our unit where they store the goods and make up the packs.

It is open members of the public living in Tayside who are experiencing unintended weight loss or poor appetite, and are concerned about the impact this is having on their health and wellbeing. The helpline is also available for carers and family members who are concerned about an individual they are supporting. The advice line will provide food advice and support to help prevent signpost undernutrition and will callers to appropriate services and partners within the community. Gemma Johnsen, Health Improvement Practitioner with NHS Tayside, said, "It is important to be aware of your weight and appetite,

particularly if you are older or have a pre-existing medical condition. There are many things which can affect our nutritional wellbeing including loneliness, mental health conditions and recovery during illness."

Keith & Ida Waddell - Zambia

Keith and Ida Waddell are Mission Partners with the United Church of Zambia (UCZ). They have been in Zambia since 1994 and served as Education and Health Secretaries at Synod Headquarters in Lusaka since 2015. Keith is a teacher at Mwandi Basic School; Ida is a nurse working predominantly in HIV/AIDS care. They have now returned to Mwandi Mission in Western Province, where Keith is Mission Partner (Special Needs) and Ida, Mission Partner (Health). Keith is focusing on the establishment of a sheltered workshop for young people and Ida, on moving the Mission Hospital to a specialist facility. This is an ecumenical appointment with the Methodist Church.


Every three months, Keith and Ida write a newsletter with information about life in Zambia. The October Newsletter begins, "It is almost three months since we returned from furlough. There has been a regular increase in the number of hours of power cuts to the country. We returned to 12 hours daily, this was increased to17 hours in August and now 21 hours on a rotational basis is the norm. Zesco's bid to introduce inflationary and frankly unaffordable emergency tariffs to pay for imported electricity was thankfully rejected by the Energy Regulation Board. The loadshedding has been caused mainly by insufficient generation capacity due to reduced water levels in the major reservoirs following low rainfall patterns in recent past years. This year has been particularly bad because of the El Nino drought."
